One of the decisions that I've been toiling over is what am I going to bring to the table? The many programs that have been on the trestle board from previous administrations will be considered for enhancement and forward projection that may assist in bringing certain items to fruition. The needed water is already in the covered wells, we need every one of us to fill up our vessels to satisfy the scarcity. Our basic operation is solely based on assessments from the craft, which is not meeting the needs of the operations. The economy of our nation has put a strain on everyone, membership is down our efforts to regain our former members wasn't completely successful, creative marketing may need to be explored to enlighten the community as to who and what we're about, expenses are steady increasing, and our financial structure is completely out dated. A business approach is being developed to bring the Grand Lodge into a corporate like operation, and our economic development department will aid in this structure, none of which will negate the guidelines of our Masonic Culture. Our two sights must become more self supporting; we currently have a \$1,000,000.00 dollar project to make some major upgrades at 4301 N. Broad Street however we must still obtain \$400,000.00 that will enable us to qualify for a \$500,000.00 rebate which is designated as a match. Which will provide us with the economic recovery that will bring some financial stability to that site; Plans also are being structured to engage with an entity that will add monthly income to the 1117 Wood Street building in Pittsburgh, PA.

All of us must take a part in bringing our goals to execution; therefore I'm seeking a fund raiser that will aid us towards bringing our headquarters to the marvel that it once was and should be. All donations received will go directly to the renovation project, donations of any amount, the donee will receive a Masonic coin in a nice encasement, those donating \$100.00 or more will receive this beautiful crystal with an etched Masonic/Logo embedded within. Our sisters have been contributing to the beautification of our Temple, and I'm sure that they will join in this fund raising effort as well. I'm convinced that once our goals are reached, and our knowledge has been increase as to how we can work with our Government and Corporate facilities we can move forward with assisting all of our lodges buildings with needed upgrades, but in the short fold we can possibly stave off any immediate increase in taxation, that will have a negative impact on all of our constitute lodges.

It is with your support, we can recover from this economic famine and come back to being that benevolent and community servant, that our fore fathers had designed this organization to be.
